
Temple Construction

- 1. Inauguration of a New Era
 - it marks the end of the wandering and the enjoyment of "rest" (goal of the Exodus)
 - Yahweh's "resting place" could now be built a permanent "house"

¹⁰ I will also appoint a place for My people Israel and will plant them, that they may live in their own place and not be disturbed again, nor will the wicked afflict them any more as formerly, ¹¹ even from the day that I commanded judges to be over My people Israel; and I will give you <u>rest</u> from all your enemies. The LORD also declares to you that the LORD will make a house for you. ¹² When your days are complete and you lie down with your fathers, I will raise up your descendant after you, who will come forth from you, and I will establish his kingdom. ¹³ He shall build a <u>house</u> for My name, and I will establish the throne of his kingdom forever. 





Temple Construction
