  - This is a command for every Christian.
  - Anger is often expressed in speech, so be quick to listen and be slow to speak.

- 2. Anger doesn't produce a life that pleases God (v.20-21a)
  - In this context, "righteousness" refers to a life that is pleasing to God (cf. Matthew 5:20-22).

Remind them to be submissive to rulers and authorities, to be obedient, to be ready for every good work, to speak evil of no one, to avoid quarreling, to be gentle, and to show perfect courtesy toward all people. For we ourselves were once foolish, disobedient, led astray, slaves to various passions and pleasures, passing our days in malice and envy, hated by others and hating one another. - 3. Continue to receive the gospel (v.21b)
  - The word that is planted is the message that Jesus has begun a new kingdom.
  - We receive it because it's a free gift; given by grace, not earned.
  - We receive it with meekness because we follow a King who was meek.
