


2 Kings 12

Jehoash was seven years old when he became king. In the seventh year of Jehu, Jehoash became king, and he reigned forty years in Jerusalem; and his mother's name was Zibiah of Beersheba. ² Jehoash did right in the sight of the LORD all his days in which Jehoiada the priest instructed him. ³ Only the high places were not taken away; the people still sacrificed and burned incense on the high places.

"High Places" in the Bible?



A generic designation of any shire or cultic installation used for worship, both of Yahweh and foreign deities (illegitimate after the construction of the temple)



King Joash: A Mixed Review 2 KINGS 12:1-21

Joash: Mixed Review

- 1. Repairing the Temple
 - displays his loyalty to Yahweh and his skillful rule as a king (like Solomon)
 - signifies the priority and restoration of the worship of Yahweh

Joash: Mixed Review

- 2. Plundering the Temple
 - displays his lack of trust in Yahweh to deliver, and foreshadows coming disaster
 - his demise at the hands of his own people is an ominous sign of disapproval

Application

- 1. Warning of Compromised Worship
 - compromise in one area of life will effect our trust of the Lord in other areas
 - external service of the Lord may mask a "heart idolatry"

Application

- 2. Longing for a Better King
 - King Jesus a king of unmixed character and uncompromised obedience
 - a king who is a Savior our perfect and eternal representative
