### Paul's Introduction and Prayers

- 1. Giving thanks for God's work in their lives (v.3-4)
- 2. God's work in their lives was a result of the hope of the gospel (v.5-6)
- 3. Epaphras, the one who taught them the gospel (v.7-8)

- Meditate on the grace and peace you have with God through Jesus

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# **BREAKDOWN OF COLOSSIANS 1:9-14**

- 1. Be filled with the knowledge of *God's will* (vs. 9)
- 2. The purpose of following *God's will* (vs. 10)
- 3. The process of fulfilling *God's will* (vs. 10-12)
- 4. The privilege of freedom in *God's will* (vs. 13-14)

<sup>9</sup> For this reason also, since the day we heard of it, we have not ceased to pray for you and to ask that you may be filled with the knowledge of His will in all spiritual wisdom and understanding, <sup>10</sup> so that you may walk in a manner worthy of the Lord, to please Him in all respects, bearing fruit in every good work and increasing in the knowledge of God; <sup>11</sup> strengthened with all power, according to His glorious might, for the attaining of all steadfastness and patience, joyously <sup>12</sup> giving thanks to the Father, who has qualified us to share in the inheritance of the saints in light. <sup>13</sup> For He delivered us from the domain of darkness, and transferred us to the kingdom of His beloved Son, <sup>14</sup> in whom we have redemption, the forgiveness of sins.

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- God's will is "spiritual" in nature and can only be discerned accordingly.

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- God has a higher purpose in mind; to walk in in manner worthy of the Lord. We are to *desire* to please God, not ourselves.
- · We must also live to please
