COLOSSIANS 1: 15-20

Christ is Preeminent!!!

Colossians 1: 15-20 (NASB)

- ¹⁵ And He is the image of the invisible God, the first-born of all creation.
- ¹⁶ For by Him all things were created, both in the heavens and on earth, visible and invisible, whether thrones or dominions or rulers or authorities – all things have been created by Him and for Him.
- $\bullet \quad ^{17}$ And He is before all things, and in Him all things hold together.
- ¹⁸ He is also head of the body, the church; and He is the beginning, the first-born from the dead; so that He Himself might come to have first place in everything.
- ¹⁹ For it was the Father's good pleasure for all the fulness to dwell in Him,
- ²⁰ and through Him to reconcile all things to Himself, having made peace through the blood of His cross; through Him, I say, whether things on earth or in heaven.

BREAKDOWN OF COLOSSIANS 1:15-20

- 1. Christ is the Preeminent *Lord of Creation* (vs. 15-17)
- 2. Christ is the Glorious *Head of the Church* (vs. 18a)
- 3. Christ is the Magnificent **Agent of Reconciliation** (vs. 18b-20)

- Christ is the Preeminent Lord of Creation (vs. 15-17)
 - Jesus is the revelation of God, exclusively and entirely, and fully embodies God's nature, making what is "invisible" visible.
 - "Firstborn" conveys the eternal Jesus' position of primary prominence and prestige over creation. (cf. John 1:1, 14)
 - Christ is the agent of creation, He has exclusive and inherent authority over it, He holds all things together, and all things find their fulfillment and consummation in Him.

- 2. Christ is the Glorious *Head of the Church* (vs. 18a)
 - Jesus is the *source* of the body of Christ, the church.
 - Jesus is *sovereign* over the body of Christ, the church.
- 3. Christ is the Magnificent *Agent of Reconciliation* (vs. 18b-20)
 - The church was *inaugurated* when Jesus was the first to rise from the dead.
 - We are no longer enemies of God! Thanks to Jesus, we are now God's redeemed children!
