# 2 Kings 20:1-21

- Q: When did these events take place?
  - just prior to Assyria's invasion of Judah recorded in 2 Kings 18-19

## 2 Kings 20:1-21

- Q: Why are these events recorded here?
  - to prepare us for the inevitable judgment of Jerusalem by Babylon; not even Hezekiah can prevent it

## 2 Kings 20:1-21

- Q: How are these two events connected?
  - both Hezekiah and Jerusalem are granted a temporary extension of life

Extension of life in the face of impending death

#### **Extension of Life**

- 1. Hezekiah's Healing
  - his David-like prayer for deliverance displays his trust in Yahweh
  - his healing and extension of life is bound up with continued "life" for Jerusalem
  - he chooses the "sign" that will mostly clearly reveal Yahweh's power to deliver

### **Extension of Life**

- 2. Babylon's Visitors
  - their visit is what elicits the Lord's prophecy of Jerusalem's future exile to Babylon
  - Hezekiah response is a recognition of the Lord's mercy and restraint – His judgment is delayed, but not canceled

### **Extension of Life**

- > Implications
  - 1. God's present delay of judgment is due to His patience and mercy (cf. 2 Peter 3:8-13)
  - 2. We have a perfect Davidic King who reigns and will never die King Jesus
