


The "Ahab" of Judah 2 KINGS 21:1-26



## 2 Kings 21:1-26

"He did much evil in the eyes of Yahweh"

- · he is compared to the Amorites, yet worse
- · he is compared to Ahab, yet worse
- he is compared to Jeroboam "he made Judah sin"

## 2 Kings 21:1-26

- 1. The Mystery of Evil's Longevity
  - displays God's longsuffering in the face of great provocation
  - as believers, we cry "how long, O Lord" as an expression of our trust and hope in Him (c.f. Psalm 94; Rev. 6:10)

## 2 Kings 21:1-26

- 2. The Certainty of God's Judgment
  - God's present patience is not His approval;
     His judgment will be just, thorough, on time and for the vindication His name
  - Manasseh's sin placed Judah beyond hope of recovery – an irreversible judgment

<sup>26</sup> For if we go on sinning willfully after receiving the knowledge of the truth, there no longer remains a sacrifice for sins, <sup>27</sup> but a terrifying expectation of judgment and THE FURY OF A FIRE WHICH WILL CONSUME THE ADVERSARIES.

- 3. The Refuge in God's Son (King)
  - God's certain and just judgment is spent on His Son for all who take refuge in Him
