- Paul declares that God's overarching, end-time goal is to bring all things back together under the headship of Christ (1:9-10, 21-23)
- As those now reconciled to God in Christ and filled with the Spirit, our relationships include proper submission to authority (5:18-6:9)

Mystery of Marriage

- > Analogy of Christ and the Church
 - (1) This analogy only applies in a complementarian understanding of marriage
 - (2) In Christ biblical headship and submission are restored not overturned

Mystery of Marriage

- > Typology of Marriage
 - (1) Christ and the church is the ultimate reality of which marriage is but a temporary metaphor
 - (2) The beauty, joy, love and satisfaction of this unending relationship will far exceed that of human marriage

Mystery of Marriage

- > Practical Outworking
 - 1. Wives submit to your own husband
 - support, respect and follow your husband's leadership and authority
 - "as to the Lord" out of obedience and ultimate submission to Christ

Mystery of Marriage

- > Practical Outworking
 - 2. Husbands love your wives
 - model the sacrificial, sanctifying, nourishing love of Christ for the church
 - commitment to the total well-being of your wife, especially her spiritual well-being
