Be patient, therefore, brothers and sisters, until the coming of the Lord. See how the farmer waits for the precious fruit of the earth, being patient about it, until it receives the early and the late rains. You also, be patient. Establish your hearts, for the coming of the Lord is at hand. Do not grumble against one another, brothers and sisters, so that you may not be judged; behold, the Judge is standing at the door. As an example of suffering and patience, brothers and sisters, take the prophets who spoke in the name of the Lord.

- 1. Honesty (v.12)
 - Not all oaths are prohibited (Rom. 1:9; 1 Thes 5:27; Luke 1:73; Acts 2:30)
 - The point: Don't use oaths to cover up deception (Matthew 5:33-37; 23:16-22)
 - Applications: Our words should reflect the truth. Our actions should align with our words.

- 2. Forbearance (v.9)
 - Forbearance: Patience with difficult people and circumstances, specifically by avoiding complaining and speaking words of compassion.

- 1. Honesty (v.12)
- 2. Forbearance (v.9)
- 3. Compassion (v.11)
 - God is *full* of compassion.
 - Those who know how much compassion they receive, should also show this compassion.
