

THE DANGER OF UNBELIEF

Hebrews 3:7-19

⁷ Therefore, just as the Holy Spirit says,

"TODAY IF YOU HEAR HIS VOICE,

⁸ DO NOT HARDEN YOUR HEARTS AS IN THE REBELLION, AS IN THE DAY OF TRIAL IN THE WILDERNESS,

WHERE YOUR FATHERS TRIED *Me* BY TESTING *Me*, AND SAW MY WORKS FOR FORTY YEARS.

"THEREFORE I WAS ANGRY WITH THIS GENERATION, AND SAID, 'THEY ALWAYS GO ASTRAY IN THEIR HEART, AND THEY DID NOT KNOW MY WAYS';

¹¹ As I swore in My wrath,

'THEY SHALL NOT ENTER MY REST."

¹² Take care, brethren, lest there should be in any one of you an evil, unbelieving heart in falling away from the living God. ¹³ But encourage one another day after day, as long as it is *still* called "Today," lest any one of you be hardened by the deceitfulness of sin. 14 For we have become partakers of Christ, if we hold fast the beginning of our assurance firm until the end, 15 while it is said,

"TODAY IF YOU HEAR HIS VOICE, DO NOT HARDEN YOUR HEARTS, AS IN THE REBELLION."

¹⁶ For who rebelled when they had heard? Indeed, did not all those who came out of Egypt led by Moses? 17 And with whom was He angry for forty years? Was it not with those who sinned, whose bodies fell in the wilderness? 18 And to whom did He swear that they would not enter His rest, but to those who were disobedient? 19 So we see that they were not able to enter because of unbelief.

The Danger of Unbelief (pt. 3)

- ❖ Avoid the unbelief of the people of God in the wilderness who failed to enter His rest - hold fast to Christ until the end
- ❖ Psalm 95:7-11 Holy Spirit's application of Israel's rebellion at Kadesh to the worshiping people of God today

¹¹ Now these things happened to them as an example, and they were written for our instruction, upon whom the ends of the ages have come. ¹² Therefore let him who thinks he stands take heed that he does not fall.

(1 Corinthians 10:11-12)

The Danger of Unbelief (pt. 3)

- 1. The Culpability of their Unbelief
 - <u>all</u> those who came out of Egypt, who entered into a covenant, who saw God's mighty works rebelled in unbelief

The Danger of Unbelief (pt. 3)

- 2. The Certainty of God's Wrath for their Unbelief
 - all those who rebelled in unbelief "fell" in the wilderness in the next 40 years as an act of God's judgment

The Danger of Unbelief (pt. 3)

- 3. The Ultimate Consequences of their Unbelief
 - God swore they would not enter the promised land, a type of His final, salvation-"rest"
 - the consequences were not merely temporal, but eternal

The Danger of Unbelief (pt. 3)

- > Implications:
 - Unbelief today in light of God's final word in His Son is more egregious and inexcusable than Israel's unbelief

The Danger of Unbelief (pt. 3)

- > Implications:
 - 2. It is possible to be part of God's people outwardly and know much about Him and yet fall away in final unbelief

The Danger of Unbelief (pt. 3)

- > Implications:
 - 3. Beware of nurturing a heart of unbelief in God's power, promise and goodness through incessant grumbling and growing disobedience
