Typology

- persons, events, and institutions that God specifically designed to correspond to and prefigure their intensified fulfillment in Christ
- · David-typology is central in the Bible

Hebrews 10:1-10

¹ For the Law, since it has *only* a shadow of the good things to come *and* not the very form of things, can never, by the same sacrifices year by year, which they offer continually, make perfect those who draw near. ² Otherwise, would they not have ceased to be offered, because the worshipers, having once been cleansed, would no longer have had consciousness of sins? ³ But in those *sacrifices* there is a reminder of sins year by year. ⁴ For it is impossible for the blood of bulls and goats to take away sins.

⁵ Therefore, when He comes into the world, He says, "SACRIFICE AND OFFERING YOU HAVE NOT DESIRED, BUT A BODY YOU HAVE PREPARED FOR ME; ⁶ IN WHOLE BURNT OFFERINGS AND sacrifices
FOR SIN YOU HAVE TAKEN NO PLEASURE. ⁷ "THEN I SAID, 'BEHOLD, I HAVE COME (IN THE SCROLL OF THE BOOK IT IS WRITTEN OF ME) TO DO YOUR WILL, O GOD.'"

⁸ After saying above, "SACRIFICES AND OFFERINGS AND WHOLE BURNT OFFERINGS AND *sacrifices* FOR SIN YOU HAVE NOT DESIRED, NOR HAVE YOU TAKEN PLEASURE *in them*" (which are offered according to the Law), ⁹ then He said, "BEHOLD, I HAVE COME TO DO YOUR WILL." He takes away the first in order to establish the second. ¹⁰ By this will we have been sanctified through the offering of the body of Jesus Christ once for all.

The Offering of Jesus

- Psalm 40:6-8
 - Christ's affirmation of obedience on the eve of His incarnation
 - David's words of response find their true significance as the Son's response to the Father (c.f. Psalm 22)

The Offering of Jesus

- 1. A Willing Obedience
 - the purpose of the Son's becoming human ("body") was to do the will of God (cf. John 4:34)
 - the Son offered His perfectly obedient life in a final act of obedience on the cross (cf. Phil. 2:8)

The Offering of Jesus

- 2. A Transformative Result
 - the entire sacrificial system of the Law has been abolished by Christ's obedience
 - the New Covenant arrangement for removal of sin, inward cleansing and complete access to God has been established

The Offering of Jesus

- 2. A Transformative Result
 - we have been set apart to God ("made holy") once for all through the offering of the obedient life of Jesus Christ on the cross
