

### Hebrews 11:17-22

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<sup>17</sup> By faith Abraham, when he was tested, offered up Isaac, and he who had received the promises was offering up his one and only *son*; <sup>18</sup> *it was he* to whom it was said, "IN ISAAC YOUR SEED SHALL BE CALLED." <sup>19</sup> He considered that God is able to raise *people* even from the dead, from which he also received him back as a type.

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#### Hebrews 11:17-22

<sup>20</sup> By faith Isaac blessed Jacob and Esau, even regarding things to come. <sup>21</sup> By faith Jacob, as he was dying, blessed each of the sons of Joseph, and worshiped, *leaning* on the top of his staff. <sup>22</sup> By faith Joseph, when he was dying, made mention of the exodus of the sons of Israel, and gave orders concerning his bones.

# THE HALL OF FAITH

Unexpected Entries: Isaac, Jacob, Joseph

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#### Isaac, Jacob, Joseph

- Inseparable from Abraham's "resurrection" faith
- Their faith is displayed as they were dying
- They continue the emphasis on faith as living with certainty that God will fulfill His promises

## Faith in the Face of Death

- 1. Isaac's Blessing of His Sons
  - Isaac passed on to Jacob, not Esau, nothing other than the promise God gave to Abraham – "things to come" (Gen. 27:29; 28:3-4)
  - Esau serves as a warning of the fate awaiting those who turn away (Heb. 12:16-17)

## Faith in the Face of Death

- 2. Jacob's Blessing of Joseph's Sons
  - he looked beyond death to the fulfillment of God's promise to Abraham through the generations (Gen. 48:15-16)
  - in his weakness he worshipped the goal of his faith was in the future promise of God

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## Faith in the Face of Death

- 3. Joseph's Dying Command
  - by faith he remembered, trusted in and acted upon the future promise of God (c.f. Gen. 15:13-14)
  - he desired to continue to identify with God's people after his death – he will inherit the future God had for them, including the resurrection

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## Faith in the Face of Death

- Application
  - God's promise of resurrection life in Christ and inheritance of the heavenly City will be our only hope and trust in our dying
  - Think often of your death in order to live wisely in the present (c.f. Ps. 90:12)

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
