## **Christians and the Law**

### **Traditional View**

- > The Law is divided into three categories:
  - Moral
  - Ceremonial
  - Civil

# **Christians and the Law**

### **Traditional View**

- Civil law only applied to the nation of Israel
- Ceremonial law is made obsolete by Christ
- Moral law is universally binding in every age

The Ten Commandments are the unchanging expression of God's eternal moral law

# **Christians and the Law**

### **Traditional View**

- Problems with this view
  - Imposes artificial categories on the Law
  - Fails to recognize that every law somehow expresses universal principles
  - Fails to see that the entire law foreshadows the work and righteousness of Christ

# **Christians and the Law**

### **Christocentric View**

 Jesus is the fulfillment of the Law in His life, teaching and work

"Do not think that I came to abolish the Law or the prophets; I did not come to abolish but <u>to fulfill.</u>" (Matthew 5:17)

### **Christians and the Law**

#### **Christocentric View**

- > Fulfillment by Jesus
  - Ethical commandments (Matthew 7:12)
  - Laws pertaining to the tabernacle, priests and sacrifices (Hebrews 7-10)
  - Laws pertaining to foods, festivals and Sabbath days (Colossians 2:16-17)
  - The Law as that which divided the Jews from the Gentiles (Ephesians 2:15)

### **Christians and the Law**

#### **Christocentric View**


- The way in which each law is fulfilled in Christ determines the way it is observed now
- We are not under the Law of Moses as a *direct* and *immediate* source of our conduct
- We are under the *"law of Christ",* which is the Law of Moses fulfilled in Christ

### **Christians and the Law**

#### 1 Corinthians 9:20-21

"...to those under the Law, as though under the Law, though *not being myself under the Law*, that I might win those under the Law;

to those without the Law, as without the Law, though not being without the law of God but under the law of Christ..." (cf. Galatians 6:2)



### **Christians and the Law**

What composes the "Law of Christ"?

The teaching and righteousness of Jesus

- the centrality of love
- the directing influence and enablement of the Holy Spirit
